#### Plainfield 250 Meeting – Jan. 10, 2011 Philip Read Library

In attendance: Margaret Drye, Donna Beaupre, Laura Dintino, Jane Fielder, Dewey Jones, Elizabeth Lurie, John Stephenson, Breck Taber, Stephen Taylor, Allen Burns and Mike Sutherland.

**4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade:** Jane will send a list of the floats from the 1961 parade to Margaret to pass on to the Plainfield parade organizers. Donna expressed concern about the marauding Indian factor of the 1961 parade and hoped that a float about Native American life could be substituted. John and Donna Moody of the Winter Center for Indigenous Studies might be of help. There was talk of getting a Concord Coach for the Grand Marshalls to ride in. Dewey will do some research about descendants of early settlers, including a write up for Plainfacts asking for information about remaining descendants from settlers as early as 1761-1764. The Plainfacts deadline is 1/20. Margaret will remind the parade organizers about a townwide photo.

**UV 250:** the new regional logo was displayed and some feedback was given. Laura will pass the feedback to the artist. More of an O needed in the handprint. Regional plans are moving along. Towns are working on their own celebrations and working on regional things too, like the speakers' series and Super Quest. The 3<sup>rd</sup> grade at PES will be writing a Colonial Quest this spring with Kathleen Maslan. More details to come. It was decided that the Super Quest clue for Plainfield will be The Ferry sign on River Road. And the clue will have information about the other ferry to Hartland too. Steve Taylor will send Laura a paragraph about the history of the ferries. (And maybe a photo.)

**Program:** Steve reported that some money (\$500) was award from the Tasker Covered Bridges Fund toward printing the program. He is going to work on some more corporate sponsors to fund it. He will get a quote from Jerry Doolittle. And there was talk of adding a copy of the Charter to the program.

Contracts and other official stuff: Margaret has signed contracts with the fireworks company and the Newmont Military Band. Nancy is awaiting a formal letter from Margaret to sign with the North Country Chordsmen. Steve Halloran is working on town wide insurance. And Paul Roberts on parade permits. Breck will plan to meet with TK Sportswear to discuss the costs and number of logo printed items including: caps, tee-shirts, banners, mugs, totes, bumper stickers, car decals. Margaret will talk to the McNamara's about a commemorative milk bottle. And Dewey will work with Nancy on the postage cancellation stamp.
