11 The meeting opened at 6:00pm.  
12

13 **Public Comment:** Dennis Girouard attended the start of the meeting to share with the Selectmen his view  
14 that the Library Trustees have shown no interest in the air conditioning proposal for the Plainfield building.  
15 Despite the efforts of staff to obtain proposals, no request for funding was brought forward this year by the  
16 Trustees.  
17

18 **Town Office:** The Selectboard signed the official warrant and budget forms for the upcoming Town  
19 Meeting. Town Administrator Steve Halleran was instructed to post the documents around town. One at  
20 the Plainfield Town Hall, one at the Meriden Town Hall and one at the elementary school, the place of  
21 voting.  
22

23 **Police Department:** Chief Roberts and the Selectboard discussed the monthly submission to Plainfacts of  
24 the Police log. The group determined that rather than submitting the actual log on a montly basis, the Chief  
25 would write a short column to be used to provide information to the community about current issues facing  
26 the Police Department.  
27

28 **Highway Department:** The Selectboard authorized Steve Halleran to move forward with investigating  
29 using a state grant program to remove, at no cost to the town, the under ground storage tanks installed in  
30 the early 1990's at the highway garage. The State has a one or two year program for tank removal. Our  
31 existing tanks still have some useful life left, however, the cost of removal is about \$20,000 and the rules  
32 for maintaining underground tanks grow more complex each year. The town's current set up needs several  
33 thousand dollars worth of upgrades to stay in compliance with current regulations.  
34

35 Selectman Belyea encouraged Steve Halleran and Paul Roberts to test the current market on the town's fuel  
36 pricing. She has been able to obtain very favorable pricing at her business by negotiating a new price  
37 structure. The town is not locked in to any particular pricing at this time, but has been with Simple Energy  
38 and Evans Fuels for a number of years.
