Exploding Targets

WHAT IS CONSIDERED SUSPICIOUS?

-  Payment in cash or someone else's credit card
-  Reluctant or unwilling to produce valid I.D.
-  Large purchases or unusual inquiries to buy in bulk
-  Lack of knowledge regarding firearms or product usage
-  Hints at illegal or misuse of explosives
-  New or unknown customers
-  Nervousness or Evasiveness

Businesses can become unwitting participants in illicit or terrorist activities. Be aware of unusual or suspicious purchases or usage of your products and services.

WHAT CAN YOU DO? FOLLOW THESE SIMPLE STEPS:

- Know your customers and report suspicious activity
- Ask customers how they plan to use the product
- Ask for customer I.D. and maintain a log of unusual purchases
- Keep track of inventory and report missing or stolen products
- Notify your local FBI WMD Coordinator of any suspicious activities
- If something doesn't seem right, notify law enforcement immediately**
